### **Exclusive Features of our School**

#### **Involvement Of Management:**

Mr. Dinesh Channawar, President and Mrs. Shubhangi Channawar, Director of Aakar Education Society are present in the school throughout the day. They are also involved in teaching various subjects, so management is fully aware of student's problem. Mr.Dinesh Channawar, President has completed four online courses of Vedic Maths. Teachers teaching Maths are trained accordingly to teach Vedic Maths through Puzzles, Games and Activities. Mrs. Shubhangi Channawar is deeply involved in grooming teachers and guiding them. She also trains students for competitive exams. Apurva Pande, Principal of the school, is a strategic woman who uses her brilliant mind to create and innovate in challenging environment. She helps teachers for handling multiple tasks skillfully.

#### **Involvement of Director (Academics):**

Shri. Arvind Gore is deeply involved in developing students and teachers. He uses innovative methods in training students on various topics using special techniques thereby bringing them into main stream.

#### **Involvement of Parents Teachers Association:**

PTA is a sign of responsibility on the part of parents. It means that parents have a contribution towards the development of a school. It is a very welcome initiative.

PTA is involved in following sectors of the school.:-

1. Deciding Annual Fees of the school. PTA members suggest the hike in fees every year by taking the efforts of the school into consideration.

2. Annual sports meet and Annual Function of the school. While deciding the strategies for these functions the suggestions by PTA members are considered first of all. Fees to be charged is decided in PTA meet.
3. School Curriculum: All members give suggestions regarding School curriculum and its implementation. They are also involved in teaching strategies of the school.
4. Scholastic Activities in school: Activities like MOM (Math-O-Mind Mathathon), Scholarship Exam, Mission IAS Exam, Language Skill Development Activities, Vedic Math's are conducted by the school very sincerely. Account of all kinds of preparations and results are first informed in Parents Teachers Association Meeting.
5. Infrastructure of the school: They all are informed about infrastructural developments of the school.
6. Planning for academic change/ improvement is discussed in last meeting of the year.

**Important Decision by PTA.:- Finance is the most important part of school functioning.**

1. This session in PTA conducted on 22<sup>nd</sup> December 2018 the management presented the complete analysis of Fees Structure, Teachers' salary and Expenditure for the session.
2. A graphical presentation based on facilities provided to the students and expenses done by the school were compared.
3. To maintain the standard of the school, the management has to increase the salary of the teachers. Salary expenditure was also presented by the management.
4. Then all PTA members were asked for the rise in fees. How much should be the percentage in rise of fees was discussed.
5. The decision was taken only after taking consent of all PTA members.

**Involvement of School Managing Committee:**

The School Managing Committee looks after following matters of the school.

1. Admission Policy
2. Welfare of the teachers and employees of the school.
3. Activities of the school for its smooth functioning.
4. To evolve both short term and long term programmes for the improvement of the school.
5. To review budget of the school presented by the principal and to approve it.
6. Academic strategies, its implementation and effectivity.
7. Results of Std.X.
8. Innovations and implementation of various new academic projects and CBSE circulars.
9. President of PTA is Chief guest of 15<sup>th</sup> August (Independence Day) and 26<sup>th</sup> January (Republic Day) Celebrations.

**Safety of Staff and Students:-** Child Protection policy is signed by school personnel. Child Help Line No.1018 is displayed in main lobby in Hindi and in English. Students are trained to understand safe touch and unsafe touch. Institution has zero tolerance policy towards child abuse. Complaint mechanism for children is made available. During recruitment of staff no candidate with criminal record is recruited. Police verification is taken into account. A child abuse monitoring committee (CAMC) is constituted. Training modules are developed as per age criteria. Internet safety protocol is established and implemented in school. Female guards are deployed in all buses for safe dispersal until the last child is dropped at home.

**Details of Teachers Training for session 2018-19:-** The school had arranged a training session for the professional development of teachers with the collaboration of Jnana Prabodhini, Pune on the topic "Class Room Management and Life Skills". It was held on 28<sup>th</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> May 2018. Total 41 teachers participated the training. (Consolidated Certificates of this training will be sent by the training institution.)

## **A CBSE Training on ‘Gender Sensitivity’ was organized in School on 16<sup>th</sup> April 2019.**

Role of teachers in schools is certainly crucial, but extremely dynamic too. Teachers need to adjust their teaching with the ever-evolving educational goals and at the same time deal with infinite variations in students, each of whom is unique. In such a scenario continuous professional quality development of teachers becomes absolutely indispensable to respond to the changing needs of the students and system.

This session One day training programme on ‘Gender Sensitivity’ was conducted at Channawar’s e Vidyamandir, Yelakeli, Wardha on 16<sup>th</sup> April 2019 between 9:00am and 5:00pm under the guidance of CBSE CoE Pune. The Resource Persons attended training programme were MADAM KANA ROYCHAUDHARI AND MADAM POOJA MAHAWADIWAR.

Total 63 participants registered for the training from different schools.

One Day Workshop was organized for Teachers based on the topic ‘Emotional Intelligence’. The Resource Person was MADAM UNNATI DATAR from Nagpur. Workshop on ‘Emotional Intelligence’ was organized on 27<sup>th</sup> April 2019 between 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.

A growing number of studies have suggested that teachers’ personal competencies and more specifically Emotional Intelligence are particularly important for teacher effectiveness. There is also a growing recognition of the importance of social-emotional competencies to students’ learning and academic achievement. However, there has been a neglect of emotions in the field of teaching.

The impact of training aimed at developing teachers’ EI on their EI levels and their practice. Most participants integrated these competencies into their personal, professional and group identities and modified their EI- related behaviours.

### **Infrastructure:**

35000 sq.ft. construction of the school contains two floors. Spacious corridors, wide staircase, airy porch, stepped classrooms, multipurpose halls, luxurious library, hygienic washroom are special features of construction. Plantation is done in 3 acres and the campus has a lush green look. 20 classrooms and 2 Computer Labs, Dance room, Science labs, Art room, Maths Lab, Multy activity rooms, separate washroom areas for boys and girls etc. are the main features of construction. All classrooms are built with auditorium design (stepped) for better visibility and attention towards teacher and teaching.

### **COMPETITIVE EXAMS**

**Homi Bhabha Bal Vaidnyanik Exam** is conducted each year by MASTA for Std. VI and IX. Aaditi Tiwari, Harshit Bhutada, Krishna Bodhe, Aditya Sharma (Std.VI) and Saukhya Hiware (Std.IX) have qualified for practical round thisw session (2018-19).

**Olympiad Exams:** “The quality of your thinking, determines the quality of your mind.” Participation in the Science, Math’s, English and General Knowledge Olympiad, itself is the biggest competition where a student competes to outshine others. It infuses a healthy competitive spirit through reward based assessment. Students from Std.I to Std.X can appear Olympiads conducted by Science Olympiad Foundation, New Delhi.

**Scholarship Exam:** Students are taught entire syllabus of Std.V and VIII in the school. Mock tests are conducted and remedial measures are adopted. Std.IV and Std.VII students are also taught scholarship syllabus for next year preparation. Coaching starts from July every year and three Mock

tests are conducted before January every year. Saukhya Hiware, Maharashtra State Scholarship, ( Std.VIII) secured 13<sup>th</sup> rank in State and 2<sup>nd</sup> rank in District. While Rudra Bokade from Std. V secured 44<sup>th</sup> rank in state among CBSE-ICSE schools.

Jr. Mission IAS Exam: For preparing students for competitive examinations and developing interest in MPSC,UPSC and similar exams after graduation, Mission IAS concept is introduced from Std.III to Std.VII. A separate book is issued and worksheets are provided for preparation in the school. 6 Mock Tests are conducted from July to February. In Junior IAS Competition Rudra Bokade stood 4<sup>th</sup> in State over all and 1<sup>st</sup> in State among English Medium Schools.

**Vedic Math:** We have introduced Vedic math for Std.III to Std. VIII. Operations like addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, square root, cube root, square and cubes etc. are taught using sutras and sub sutras thus enhancing mental calculation speed, intelligence and logical ability. Math-O-Mind Mathathon is an in house competition which consists of pen paper tests as well as tests on software. Two topper students from each class are rewarded with attractive prizes.

## INNOVATIVE INITIATIVES

**Work Experience:** Every Monday two periods are dedicated for work experience. Students from Std. I to X participate in this activity. In these two periods in-house or guest lecturers guide students on various issues and topics ranging from local to national and international, academics, life skills, History, Geography, Geopolitical, Diplomatic issues, General Knowledge, Current affairs, Politics, Elections, Spirituality, Mental Ability, Analytical Thinking, and whatever it takes to mould a person in such a profound way to make them ready to face any type of competitive exam with all the needed preparedness. Topics like Doklam crisis, Chabhar port, GST, Demonetization, Functioning of Parliament, Indian and International Judiciary system. Information on Brahmos and sukhoi – 30 fighter aircraft combination & its effect on our defense system were explained with the help of various videos etc. We also show old classic songs and information on great singers and musician along with other renowned and acclaimed personalities. This year our prime focus is on two great personalities of Indian history “Shivaji Maharaj & Swami Vivekanand” . Guests Lectures are organized for carrier counseling and future job opportunities for new generations.

1) From a non-profit company,working for social cause, Dr. Sarita Mishra and Mr.Prabhakar Mishra guided students on the topic ‘Sustainable Development’.

2) Mr. Tushar Taywade and Mr. Nilesh Rahate from Cube Design visited school for guiding students for ‘Organic Farming’.

3) Ms. Afin Ajani had a fair conversation with students for Career Pathways and Future job opportunities.

**Hands On Experience:** Agricultural sector occupies a vital position in the overall economy of our country. Management has purchased 3 acres of land in order to provide hands on experience from Std. I onwards in agricultural practices. They will also learn dignity of labour. They are shown different stages of growth of various vegetables growing in the field. This was our first year.

This session (2019-20) the agricultural land is cultivated under the guidance of Mr. Rahul Taywade, Morshi. Students are getting experience of sowing seeds and harvesting crops in Scientific manner.

Classes from Std.I to X visit farm periodically and observe the growth of crops and process of farming.

**Computer Education:** The School has two state of art computer labs with 60 latest versions of computers installed with latest software. Where in students are taught to work on software like GIMP, PICASA, PIVOTE ANIMATOR, SCRATCH etc. Programming Languages like C+ +,

Html, Java are taught. We also have Vedic math software for students to practice in real time quick calculations of all mathematical operations.

**Reading, Listening, Speaking & Writing Skill Development Program:** This in house program helps building reading ability. Students are taught phonetics and then words with correct intonation, pronunciation and stress. Word building is taught using audio visual aids. Students are tested and corrective measures are adopted. Various study material and material needed for various activities are prepared and used by our teachers.

**e books:** All the subjects are taught using e books Digital content provides fresh inputs and enriched visual appeal. Learning is faster and has more retention. Many concepts are taught by using stories, animations and PowerPoint presentations.

**Math Lab:** Our math lab is equipped with charts, puzzles and modern equipments. They help in clearing mathematical concepts faster. Various activities are performed regularly. Software is installed in Math Lab.

**Science Lab:** To enhance the learning ability and skill, and impart practical exposure about theoretical concepts learned, the school has a composite science lab with projector and interactive board. The lab has models and equipments designed as per NCERT Curriculum.

**Assembly:** We conduct different types of morning assemblies like Yoga assembly, student's assembly, silent assembly etc. Assembly acts as a platform for students to gain confidence. We introduce new word and idiom daily. News analysis is done for the students. Informative videos are shown to the students every week to broaden their horizon including other regular features. Yoga assembly is the best mean the school has used to inculcate health consciousness, sensitivity towards biome, empathy and necessity of exercises.

This Session (2019-20) Assembly is more Student- centric. Involvement of parents is increased in assemblies. Students are performing theater activity, scientific experiences, skits, songs, dances, speeches, extempore etc. in assembly.

**Community Outreach:** The school believes in reaching to community and to transform the society. To bring change in society as the future citizens of India community outreach is the best source. Activities like Dengue Awareness, ORS supplement for safety, Healthy Food Habits, Tobacco awareness among drivers were initiated by students under the guidance of stakeholders.

**CCTV Cameras in Buses & Vans:** Management is thinking to install CCTV Cameras in all buses and vans for assuring security of all students. This will also ensure discipline in buses. Already 56 cameras are fitted in all classrooms, labs, corridors and exit locations. Same facility can be started in school buses and vans by paying extra charges.

**GPS Tracking In School Buses:** GPS tracking system (RIG- V) will be installed in the schools buses and linked to live android application. By using this service, parents can track live status of running bus of their ward which helps them to get rid of morning anxiety of missing the bus and evening worries of ward coming late. By using this app in Smartphone they can track exact location of their ward's bus. This can be started if parents agree to pay extra charges for the same.

**Library:** School has spacious 1500 sq. ft. library with 3500 plus books. Students are motivated to read and get books issued regularly. They have 2 to 3 Library periods per week.

**Multipurpose Hall:** A 2500 feet hall is used for conducting meetings, seminars, assembly and subject enrichment activities.

**Daily SMS Facility:** A daily SMS is sent to all parents from Nursery to Std. 6 to inform them about class work and home work. General information is sent via SMS thus saving paper.

**Broadcast Groups:** Photographs of celebrations and functions are sent using broadcast facility. Important information is also shared with parents from this platform. New words & Idioms are sent to parents through Broadcast Group for revision of students on daily basis.

**Educational Excursions And Field Visits:** They provide rich experience and aids learning process. They learn to adjust with each other and are exposed to new horizons and aspects at life.

**Annual Function & Sport Meet:** These are held alternate years in our school.

**Annual Function:** It is an event for which our students and parents wait for two years. It is a full package of entertainment and drama. All the students from Nursery to X participate in the two days annual function.

**Sport Meet:** It is an event for which students keep on preparing two years where sports are blended to be presented as stage activities and sport events.

**Adventure Sports:** Under the supervision of trained instructor students (std. 3 onwards) learn hurdle crossing like horizontal bars, Iron net, commando net, Tarzan Jump, Tyre crossing, Burma Bridge, etc. V shaped, Tyre Bridge, Some new Bridges & hurdles will be added this year.

**Sports:** Carrom, Chess, Khokho, Kabaddi, Net ball, Volley ball, Foot ball are games taught in our school. Our students participate in various District and state level competitions.

I onwards in agricultural practices. Agricultural sector occupies a vital position in the overall economy of our country. They will also learn dignity of labour. They are shown different stages of growth of various vegetables growing in the field. Students from all classes have respective areas for plantation. They planted different crops /plants and gathered information about it like its Scientific name, uses, medicinal values etc.

Through Health and Physical Education activities like practice of Indigenous Sports, Yoga and Environment related activities like Plantation, First Aid, Rallies based on 3Rs- Reduce, Recycle, Reuse and Anti corruption, the school tries to develop an Environment conscious, Sporty, Empathetic and Spiritual youth of India. The school had organized activities like Cleanliness Drive and Community Lunch to inculcate empathy, social awareness and sensitivity towards Food Security.

**Medical Camps:** Are conducted regularly to identify health issues among students and keep an eye on their development. Necessary instructions are given to students and passed on to parents as information. On 6<sup>th</sup> December 2018, the school organized MR Vaccination Campaign through which 97% of total strength was vaccinated.

On account of National Deworming Day the Vaccination of Tablet Albendazole was done on 21-08-2019. Total 628 (61%) Students were vaccinated.

On 23<sup>rd</sup> August Vaccination of DPT,TD was done in school for students of Std. V,VI , IX & X. Total 240 students were vaccinated through this programme.

**Result Analysis:** Session 2017-18 was our First Batch of Std.X. Total 37 students appeared AISSE'18. Being the first batch was not an obstacle for our achievers. Following is the analysis of the Result.
